New and Enabling Software Technologies

Presented by Bronwyn Evans, Principal, Tethys Consulting

This ACS-member free forum takes a fresh look at how new and enabling software technologies are driving the Information and Communications Technology industry.

About the presentation:

Gartner believes we are on the cusp of the most fundamental change to business since the Internet. Although business processes have been "hype" for some time, most businesses are only now starting to understand the importance and impact of a processcentric approach to the business.

During this presentation, Bronwyn will review some implications of the Internet age on user expectations of business applications and look at the sorts of software technologies that are required to support the new ways of doing business. Bronwyn will consider what this means for companies. In addition, Bronwyn will examine the transformation from the information age to the knowledge age, what this means for organisations and the sort of software technologies that are making this a reality.

About the presenter:

Bronwyn Evans is a principal of Tethys Consulting, a firm which specialises in business process improvement, enterprise software evaluation and enterprise software

implementation. Bronwyn is a committee member of Females in Information Technology & Telecommunications (FITT) who are sponsored by the Australian Information Industry Association (AlIA) and the Australian Computer Society (ACS). She received the SWAP Australia National Entrepreneur of the Year Award in 2003 and was nominated for the international CSC Award for Technical Excellence for her work in applying group decision support technologies to business process redesign. Bronwyn has been regularly quoted in MIS Australia articles.
